Update: Indicators for the SDGs

Proposed timeline:

- **21 Sept**: Updated list of proposed indicators circulated
- 15 Oct: Deadline for final comments on updated list
- 26 28 Oct: 2nd meeting of IAEG-SDGs (Bangkok)
- **30 Nov**: Indicator proposal submitted to 47th session of UNSC
- March 2016: Global indicators finalized and adopted by UNSC, to be later adopted by ECOSOC and the UN GA

Update: Indicators for the SDGs

Why is this important?

- Accountability: Technically sound indicators that accurately measure progress will provide the baseline for holding Member States accountable to achieving the new goals and targets by 2030;
- Health in all policies: Opportunity to demonstrate how NCDs are integrated across the SDGs and ensure governments make progress towards reaching Target 3.4;
- Evidence: On progress, and on how multisectoral partnerships can be utilized to achieve the goals and targets;
- Visibility: Maximize visibility of NCDs throughout the 2030 Agenda.



Update: Indicators for the SDGs

Current proposed indicators for NCD targets:

- **Target 3.4**: The probability of dying of CVD, cancer, diabetes or chronic respiratory disease between 30 70 years of age
- Target 3.a: Age-standardized prevalence of current tobacco use among persons age 18+

NCDA Submission to IAEG-SDGs Consultation

- Target 3.4: Proposed alignment with existing indicators in WHO Global Monitoring Framework
- Proposed indicators for Target 2.2 (nutrition), Target 3.5
 (substance abuse), Target 3.6 (road traffic injuries), Target 3.9
 (air pollution), Target 7.1 (sustainable energy), Target 11.2
 (safe transport and physical activity)



NCD Alliance Indicator Consultation Process

January 2015

- Initial NCDA network consultation
- Result: Table
 with proposed
 indicators for
 NCD relevant
 targets

August 2015

- Consultation based on proposed indicators
- Result: Collective NCD community submission to IAEG-SDGs consultation process

Next Steps

- Follow IAEG-SDGs indicator process through March 2016
- Continue to input into process to ensure strong NCD indicators

- 21 Sept: updated global indicators framework released
- 15 Oct: deadline for comments on updated framework

 - President of Kenya and President of Croatia will cochair the dialogue addressing health








Strengthening NCD Civil Society in the EMR



Overview:


- 1-2 September 2015 in Cairo, Egypt
- **52 participants** incl. 37 representatives from CSOs from 12 of the EMR countries; NCD Alliance, WHO country /regional staff, UNDP
- Aimed to strengthen the civil society movement in the region by facilitating sharing of experiences, review capacity and fostering alliances to drive advocacy, policy and accountability
- NCDA commissioned a <u>background paper</u> mapping EMR CSOs
- Identified EMR civil society priorities for joint follow-up & action
- Built momentum for establishment of a regional NCD Alliance and alliances at national level (e.g. Saudi Arabia)
- WHO news story, incl. Video Message by HRH Princess Dina Mired of Jordan accessible here.








Priority Audience






Focus of Work






Priority Focus of Interventions








Major Gaps in Civil Society Response






Potential Solutions to Address CSO Gaps










Priorities for Action at Regional Level





Implications for CSOs in EMR

- Build multisectoral coalitions across NCD CSOs at national level;
- Establish regional platforms for networking, information sharing and advocacy support – particularly on transborder issues;
- Leverage lessons learnt from tobacco control;
- Support Governments develop and implement national NCD plans/policies;
- Monitor progress and hold Governments accountable;
- Advocate for integration of NCDs in development plans.



Meeting Recommendations and Outcomes

Official Report with recommendations for civil society, WHO, governments and NCDA (to be publically available by next week):

- WHO EMRO and the NCD Alliance to support CSO capacity building activities (trainings, workshops) in the region
- Meeting participants to establish regional NCD Alliance and national alliances as appropriate with support from WHO EMRO and NCD Alliance
- WHO to conduct comprehensive mapping of EMR NCD CSOs
- WHO to facilitate greater engagement of NCD CS in projects/programmes at national and regional level

GCM/NCD Working Groups

Working Group on Financing – Interim Report Public Consultations

- NCD Alliance Submission available <u>here</u>:
 - Recommendations to be far more specific to compel action w/o delay
 - Matrix of financing options for Member States; practical, step-wise approach scale up resources for NCDs according to country income level
 - Propose additional recommendation on tracking resources for NCDs, including domestic resources, ODA, and investments from intl. Partners
 - Ensure inclusion of Final Report in formal reporting to 69th World Health Assembly via 138th session of WHO Executive Board

Extension of deadline for consultation to 15 September.

Working Group on Private Sector Engagement – Interim Report

• For **Public Consultation** by September 15, NCD Alliance Submission under development
