

## Statement at the 71<sup>st</sup> World Health Assembly Agenda Item 11.7: Preparation for the third High-level Meeting of the General Assembly on the Prevention and Control of Non-communicable Diseases, to be held in 2018

I make this statement on behalf of ADI, supported by the NCD Alliance.

NCDs, including mental and neurological conditions, are the social justice issue of our time and a threat to sustainable development worldwide. The report highlights that progress on NCDs at the national level remains inadequate. WHO's newly-launched investment case 'Saving lives, spending less', shows a 15% reduction in premature NCD mortality by 2030 could be achieved at a cost of just \$1.27 per person per year in LMICs. Despite being identified by Member States as the highest priority for technical cooperation at country level, only 70% of the sum allocated to NCDs in WHO's 2016-17 budget was mobilised.

The report notes that the 2018 UN HLM on NCDs 'will provide the **last opportunity** for Member States to affirm their strong political commitment and reinforce action'. We call on countries to prioritise the **2018 UN HLM on NCDs and its preparatory process** through political and technical provisions to ensure:

- 1. Participation of heads of state and government, as outlined in the draft resolution, reflecting appropriate attention on NCDs as a major threat to human health and development requiring urgent high-level action;
- 2. Political mobilisation across health and relevant non-health sectors and meaningful engagement of people living with NCDs and civil society to reinforce a whole of government and whole of society approach;
- 3. An action-oriented outcome document with bold commitments for all relevant sectors, namely to put people first, increase financial investment, address childhood obesity, adopt health-promoting fiscal policies, accelerate achievement of UHC, and improve accountability.

Finally, we call on Member States to participate in the interactive civil society hearing in advance of the UN HLM, scheduled for 5 July. This crucial preparatory meeting is an opportunity for Member States to hear the priorities of, and strengthen engagement with civil society and other stakeholders.
