We call on Member States to endorse and implement WHO's updated set of cost effective NCD interventions ("Appendix III" of the Global NCD Action Plan) to protect populations against preventable death and disability.

Protect future generations, commit to address CHILDHOOD OBESITY

Member States must implement national responses to tackle childhood obesity, including by addressing the **commercial drivers** of this epidemic.

The WHO Implementation Plan on Ending Childhood Obesity provides a compelling set of evidence-based policies and regulatory and legislative interventions to protect and promote healthy diets and physical activity.

At the WHA, we call on Member States to **mandate the** development of a childhood obesity monitoring and evaluation framework, building on existing indicators and reporting mechanisms, to track progress in the implementation of the plan.

Move from rhetoric to action: Mobilise adequate and sustained FINANCIAL RESOURCES for NCDs

NCDs severely lack adequate, predictable and sustained resources at global and national levels. Closing the resource gap for NCDs will require multiple financing sources, including creating and optimising fiscal space for NCD investment domestically, exploring innovative financing mechanisms, leveraging development aid, and incentivising private sector investment.

Furthermore, Member States must ensure adequate financing of WHO's work on NCDs, which is chronically underfunded. An increase in assessed contributions from Member States is critical to allow the WHO to effectively deliver on its programme of work and to close the funding gap for NCDs.



to the next WHO Director-General: Embrace and lead on

an integrated vision for NCD prevention and control

Making progress on NCDs will require moving the dial on policy coherence and integrated care for NCDs, including within Universal Health Coverage. The NCD community is looking to the next WHO Director-General for visionary leadership to strengthen WHO's role as the leading UN agency on NCDs. By harnessing the potential for co-benefit solutions for NCDs across different dimensions of sustainable development, and prioritising the mobilisation of adequate and sustained financial resources for WHO's work on NCDs, WHO can deliver much needed technical assistance at the national level and facilitate action and accountability at the global level.
